Probate Court Project Update By Jim Dempsey

All surviving Hamilton County probate accounts and inventories dated before March 28, 1884 have been converted to digital images. Thanks to the rapid work of all those who volunteered, all of those indexes have been typed. I am in the process of resolving the names where the spelling is in question and incorrect page numbers. As of mid December, 27% of the accounts and 0% of the inventory pages have been verified correct.

The accounts are in 23 books (7,246 names) and inventories in 13 books (3,050 names). Since I will be adding the names of all minor children plus any omissions, I estimate at least 300-400 names will be added before I am finished. I will provide more detail in the March 2012 Tracer.

I can't thank enough the volunteers who participated, the speed they accomplished a difficult task and willingness to do two and even three of the indexes. Those who contributed their time are: Marilyn Armstrong, Bob Brodbeck, Glenn Cornish, Irma David, Peg Fay-Feder, Jeff Herbert, Dan Jungclas, Dick Okenfuss, Kay Ryan, Fred Schroeder, Jerry Volker and Barbara Wegley.

Irish Church Update By Mary Ann Faloon

Two websites provide searchable databases for Irish Church Records. Both sites added additional records earlier this fall.

Irish Genealogy is run by the Dept. of Arts, Heritage and the Gaeltacht and as a government agency provides all information at no cost. In October, <u>IrishGenealogy.ie</u> added data for seven Roman Catholic parishes in Dublin. Fifteen Roman Catholic parishes in Cork have also been added. These are in addition to the existing records available for Kerry (Roman Catholic and Church of Ireland), Carlow (Church of Ireland), and previous

records for Dublin (Roman Catholic, Church of Ireland, and Presbyterian.) Records at Irish Genealogy include all names associated with the event, including the participants and sponsors or witnesses.

Roots Ireland provides free searches of their databases, including an advanced search option. There is a fee to view all information in the record. In November, the first records for County Monaghan were added. These include three Roman Catholic parishes and three Church of Ireland parishes. County Waterford records were added in October. Records for County Wicklow were added last June. County Wexford is the next County on the schedule.

2012 Off to a Great Start

Generosity

We start the New Year recognizing the generosity of genealogists towards the Library. For more than 20 years, the Hamilton County Genealogical Society has raised money from its members for the J. Richard Abell Trust Fund, which the Society established to support purchases for Ohio related genealogy materials. We started the year off with a donation from the Chapter of \$1,300. This money was augmented by other donations: a bequest from the Warren Joy estate for \$1,000; donations from individuals directly to the Library; and honoraria from genealogy conferences in appreciation of presentations by Genealogy and Local History librarians.

Book donations boost our collection and add to its exceptional status. We received over 100 genealogy related books in 2011, including compiled family histories, Civil War regimental histories, transcribed records from nearby Ohio counties and further away locales like Alabama and Canada. Many of the books were unique items, such as bank account ledgers, or copies with few remaining originals, such as yearbooks and alumni directories. Others were the latest published works, some with small print runs. None of the donations were available online.

1937 Flood

Few events in Cincinnati's history evoke so much interest as the 1937 Flood, our city's worst natural disaster. The flood is a great source of family stories. In recognition of the 75th anniversary of The Flood, the Library will present an exhibit, *River Still Rising: The 1937 Flood* in the Joseph S. Stern, Jr. Cincinnati Room, opening on January 14. On Flood Remembrance Day, January 28, the Library will host a series of flood related programs (see calendar for details). During the entire month, we will record video interviews of first hand accounts of the 1937 Flood. To participate, contact Brian Powers at 369-6907 to schedule an appointment.

Programs

Genealogists know that knowledge of an ancestor's home adds great depth to family histories. Many genealogists harbor a fascination for historic houses and some have even conducted house histories. This month we begin a series entitled *My Cincinnati House*. The series opens with Jim Creech's house built in the heart of Over-the-Rhine in 1847. Jim tells us that when he bought the 140 year old house he didn't know he would "be moving in with the many people who preceded (him) and whose lives left their imprint on the property." This year's Black History Month lecture series focuses exclusively on genealogy as we present *Who Do You Know You Are?* Genealogy and Local History librarian Brian Powers has worked with local politician William Mallory, educator John Bryant, and musician Bootsy Collins, tracing their family histories. Join us for this fascinating exploration of their genealogies and formative years in Cincinnati. See calendar for details.

Library Services Tailored to You

The Public Library of Cincinnati and Hamilton County continues to develop services tailored to its customers. In 2011, we recognized that a "one size fits all card" does not work for all our customers. While we encourage our users to obtain a full service card, some of researchers who only use reference books and computer access may find that an Internet-only card best fits their needs. Paper guest passes now only allow one hour of Library computer access/day, but Internet-only cards can be used all day. These cards can be obtained at the Genealogy and Local History reference desk and require proof of identification. Out of town visitors can request a temporary library card with all day computer access privileges and all can use the Library's wifi on their personal devices for the catalog, Internet, and free access to subscription databases, such as Ancestry.com.

Boopsie

Tech minded genealogist will be excited to hear about an app offered by the Library early this year for smart phones and tablets. The free Boopsie app will allow customers to check out books using their phones. A feature that's sure to be popular with genealogists on the road is the ability to use a phone or tablet to scan the barcode of a book at another library or from a book vendor and determine whether our Library owns the book. If we don't, use Boopsie to send a request for purchase on the spot.
