Findmypast Announces Plans to Publish Cincinnati & Chicago Sacramental Records Online For the First Time

- Findmypast's exclusive Catholic Heritage Archive continues to grow.
- In a new partnership with the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, over 3 million names in original sacramental registers will be digitized, fully indexed and published online for the very first time.
- A further 1.9 million records covering the Archdiocese of Chicago will also be released in partnership with FamilySearch International.

Archdiocese of Cincinnati Records

These records encompass 19 counties in Southwest Ohio: Hamilton, Adams, Auglaize, Brown, Butler, Champaign, Clark, Clermont, Clinton, Darke, Greene, Highland, Logan, Mercer, Miami, Montgomery, Preble, Shelby, and Warren. Digitization will soon be underway. Over 800,000 fully indexed images of original Cincinnati Catholic registers containing over 3 million names in baptism and marriage records from 1834 to 1920 and burial records to 1953 will be made available online for the first time, only at Findmypast, in 2018.

Chicago Records

An additional 1.9 million Chicago records in sacramental registers will also be posted to the site later in the year. Published in association with FamilySearch International, these records will cover 125 years of the city's history (1864 to 1989) and will add yet another important region to Findmypast's growing collection of United States Catholic records.

On May 17, 2017 your Chapter Board met on a Sunday for several hours to have a long-range planning meeting to discuss things we just don't have time for at regular board meetings. We generated many ideas to follow up on and in the last two meetings we revisited some of these ideas. We believe we need a person to be in charge of marketing and publicity to promote our programs and other Chapter accomplishments and newly discovered resources so we will soon have a publicity person. Let me know if you want to assist this soon-to-be-named person.

OTHER IDEAS WE ARE WORKING ON

We believe we need to support the Ohio Genealogical Society in more ways so we are sponsoring two sessions to pay the speaker at their 2018 Conference in Columbus, OH in April. We want to get involved in the grand reopening the of the Cincinnati History Library & Archives when it opens after major renovations in February 2019, so we contacted them and are working on a plan to work with them for this big event. We want to host another national genealogy convention in the future and 2023 would be a great time as it will be our 50th anniversary as a Chapter. We did host two FGS and one NGS Conventions to date and have now contacted FGS to throw our "hat into the ring" to do it again in 2023 or some other year.

Our Chapter has made major inroads of cooperation with the Catholic Archives and indexing Methodist church records in the last few years and are now revisiting our relationship with the Episcopal church records and other resources. It was suggested we need to hold more programs where individual members can get more answers to their specific research "brick walls" so we plan to hold more programs where you can ask direct questions to expert panels or seasoned experienced local researchers about your families or how to apply and locate the documents needed to join one our Chapter lineage societies.

We believe many of you might want to purchase an electronic version of our *Guide to Genealogical Research* in Cincinnati & Hamilton County, Ohio so you can have it

on your computer for use at all times. Updates and new information could also be readily added to this helpful and useful tool. Of course we want to expand much more information to our already terrific website. We are working on many more ideas. Please share your ideas with us.

ANNUAL AWARDS

Each April we present awards to members and others in the genealogical community at our Annual Spring Seminar. Now is the time to share with me (Kenny Burck, the Awards Chair) or any other Board member about a person who has helped not only you but others in furthering their research with assistance at a library, a great local speaker who motivated you a number of times, someone who authored a great book of local interest to our members, or in any other way deserves some recognition for things they did in the last year or longer. Let us know of your ideas.

RESEARCH IDEAS

As a genealogy society some of our main functions are to provide quality education programs, index Hamilton County records and make them available to you, or let you know where to go to get them. We want all of you to be proficient genealogists and to get better and better at it. However, sometimes you may need some outside assistance or someone local that has some experience or insight to get you past a specific issue that has been plaguing you. Or you may not live locally and do not "know the ropes" on possible places to look for the information you seek. We do ask members once each year that if they want to assist others with area research they can be added to our list that come out anew each February. The list of 14 local researchers (they provide this service for a fee) is on our website or you can ask for a list to be sent to you via our voice mail or Chapter email. Each researcher lists their contact information and up to 40 words to describe what services or specialties they may provide for you. Most researchers are on the list year after year but sometimes a person drops off the list because they have too many clients to handle. A new list will appear sometime in February 2018. You might want to consider it.

We also offer a Chapter research service. This is a group of Chapter volunteers that look up specific information in most or all of our Chapter publications or other local resources. The fee is \$10 for one name for one hour and more for non-members. More details are listed on our website. You can pick the specific resources you

want checked if you ask in advance. I want to thank our Chair, Ann Hambrecht and her volunteer researchers Marilyn Armstrong, Jean Widmer and Kym Pitman.

We also have a Chapter voice mail at 513-956-7078 where you can leave a question and we will get back to you usually within a week (many times sooner). We cannot do research for you on the phone but many times you just need a little direction and we are happy to assist you. This is a free service. And our website always gets bigger and better with even more information if you are a member.

A BIG THANK YOU TO ALL

I am one of the longest dues-paying member of our Society as I attended meetings in 1975, joined in 1976 and have served on the Board since 1987. I have seen the "tons" of volunteer hours and dedication that goes into serving our membership. I have seen our numbers grow from the low 20s to over 1300 plus. Remember to save your entries. There are other tabs where you can update your interest areas (Custom Data), add Surnames, and change your Login Name and Password (Member Settings). Make sure you check your entries for accuracy because this information is used for *The Tracer* delivery and to contact you about programs and the availability of the *Gazette* and *Tracer* online.

If you have forgotten your Login Name or Password, follow the prompts by clicking on the ? on the Login screen. If you have forgotten both pieces of information you must retrieve them separately, Login Name first, then enter your Login name and follow the ? prompts to reset your password.

Deed Index 2 for deed books 21 to 56 (1823 to 1836), with buyer surnames A through Z, should be ready on January 1, 2018 on our website at https://hcgsohio.org/cpage.php?pt=147.

This index contains over 15,000 entries with a considerable number of poorly spelled surnames. I decided not to hold back over 14,500 good entries while trying to resolve the questionable spelling. So, as time permits in 2018, I will be correcting the names with "?" added.

Work has begun on deed index 1, 1793-1823, deed books B to W2, with over 40% out to be transcribed.

DNA Update By Kathy Reed


